

Refuse and Recycling

All tenants are jointly responsible for the disposal of waste at the property.

Most waste can be recycled, and recycling collections take place weekly, and so are the most efficient way to dispose of your waste.

Recycling containers are provided by Gwynedd Council and are clearly labelled to show what can be placed in each container (see next sheet). Large Wheelie bins should only be used for waste that cannot be recycled.

Please note that if you do not recycle your rubbish correctly, then you will soon run out of space in the wheelie bin(s)

Recycling is collected weekly, and wheelie bins are emptied **every 3 weeks**.

All containers/bins must be placed by the kerb the night before collection.

Kerbside waste collection dates are displayed on the house noticeboard.

Pests and Vermin

All refuse must be contained within the wheelie bin or recycling boxes provided. Compress all refuse in wheelie bins to maximise space and ensure that lids close.

Gulls are a real nuisance around Bangor and will quickly rip open bags, or remove refuse from open bins in search of food. Once opened, refuse will then attract rats and whilst we have bait stations located outside all properties, these cannot work to control the rat population if they have other food available.



Recycling - What goes in each box?

Top Box - Paper

- Newspaper
- Magazines
- Office paper
- Junk mail
- Shredded paper
- Card

Middle Box – Plastic and Cans

- Food and drink cans
- Foil
- Aerosols
- Plastic Bottles
- Plastic pots, tubs and trays
- Food and Drink Cartons

NOT soft plastic such as plastic bags
wrapping, crisp packets, cling film etc

Lower Box - Glass

- Glass Bottles
- Glass Jars
